Red Cherry

Traditional super sweet red cherry and crack-resistant.



## Sungold

This orange cherry is nature's candy at its finest!



Black Cherry

High-yielding, purple-brown cherry tomato with great flavor. Indeterminate variety.



#### Bumblebee Mix

Includes Sunrise, Pink, and Purple Bumblebee cherry tomatoes. All three varieties have fruity flavor and heirloom appearance. Let us know which color you prefer!



### Honeydrop

Exceptionally sweet, full-bodied tomato, great for snacking. Early producer with smooth flavor



#### Sweet Prince

The latest star from Chef Dan Barber from Blue Hill Stone Barns. This two-bite tomato is great for roasting, sautéing and dehydrating—if you can resist eating them raw.



Mountain Magic

Gorgeous Campari-style tomatoes will ripen in a cluster on the vine! This two-bite tomato is perfect for salads or snacking.



Valentine Grape

Classic red grape tomato. Early & crack resistant!



Golden Rave

Words cannot express our ardour for this amazingly flavorful yellow roma! The perfect tomato for fresh eating as well as sauce making. Disease resistant and productive!



#### Blush

This two bite tomato is like an extra-long cherry. Fruity-sweet flavor, similar to our beloved Striped German, but much less of a wait!



#### Brad's Atomic

This one of a kind saladette tomato is perfect for salads or snacking! It starts out black with green streaks and ripens to a blush of red. Deep flavor and an appearance that will wow!



## Midnight Roma

From Chef Dan Barber of Blue Hill at Stone Barns, this unique purple & red roma can be eaten fresh, cooked for sauce, or even dried! Semi-determinate bush habit.



## Speckled Roman

Gorgeous golden stripes on this red plum tomato lends unique looks to tasty sauce. Cooks down quickly into sauce but can still be eaten raw.



#### San Marzano

Indeterminate and long-vining plants produce classic paste tomato with elongated shape. Great for tomato sauce.



Plum Perfect

Determinate and bushy plants produce tons of paste tomatoes at once. Great for canning sauces and salsas at home due to the concentrated harvest.



Green Zebra

Green Zebra is a bit of a misnomer - while this fruit starts out fully green, it ripens to yellow with green stripes. A truly unique appearance and fruity-sweet taste similar to other yellow tomatoes.



Mai Tai

Heirloom taste and appearance but with the disease resistance of a hybrid. Big slicer, perfect for sandwiches. Ripens to orange with pink blush on the bottom!



#### Enroza

6-8 oz beefsteak with exceptional flavor and texture. Fruit clusters are tidy and plants have excellent disease resistance. Like Big Beef but with deeper flavor and smaller



Cuba Libre

This dark "hyloom" gives the rich deep flavor and appearance of an heirloom with the vigor and production of a hybrid.



Big Beef

Early, big and tasty with full flavor!



#### Cherokee Carbon

Vigorous heirloom quality dark red/purple fruits. Cross between Purple Cherokee & Carbon.



Dr. Wyche's

Smooth texture and tropical, sweet taste on nearly-seedless large fruits that can typically weigh llb. Color is a glowing tangerine orange on the vine.


#### Pink Tie Dye

This large, dark red tomato ripens with unique green stripes. Beautiful, yet normal enough even for the traditionalists! Green shoulders when ripe.



#### Thorburn Terracotta

Honey-brown skin, orange-pink flesh, green seed mass. Introduced in 1893 by James Thorburn of New York! A local favorite. Mid-season producer.



## Habanada

Floral habanero flavor with none of the heat. These unique sweet peppers are super productive and can be eaten roasted like Shishitos or sliced into salads.



## Yellow Snacking

Crunchy yellow snacking peppers are the perfect pairing with red and orange! Orange and yellow snacking peppers are slightly larger than the reds. Kids love 'em!



## Orange Snacking

Super sweet snacking peppers ripen fast and are slightly larger than the red variety.



## Red Snacking

Petite red peppers, perfect for snacking since the seed cavity is super small and concentrated toward the stem.



## Patchwork Snacking

If you want to elevate your snacking pepper game, give this savory variegated option from Chef Dan Barber at Blue Hill at Stone Barns a try! Not a sweet pepper.



#### Shishito

This mild Japanese pepper is small with thin walls making it ideal for roasting! Characteristically eaten green; eventually ripens to orange/red.



## Aura Pepper

Our favorite pepper! Faster to ripen than the bells, but with the same thick, juicy walls! These 4" long, cone-shaped sweets are more productive and mature early!



## Glow Pepper

The orange sister to Aura & Lipstick! Faster to ripen than bell peppers, but with the same thick, juicy walls.



## Lipstick Pepper

The red sister to Aura! Faster to ripen than bell peppers, but with the same thick, juicy walls! Mid-sized.



#### Yellow Bell

This crisp yellow bell is early and disease resistant for the ultimate gardening success!



## Orange Bell

This blocky orange bell brings colorful, crisp snacking to the garden! Requires patience for peppers to ripen from green to orange.



#### Red Bell

This 4-lobed, thick-walled bell pepper is great for fresh eating or stuffing. Like all bells, these are slow to ripen to red.



## Jimmy Nardello

Frying Sweet red frying pepper! 8" long, 1" wide with thin walls

and ripply skin.



#### Lantern Habanero

Early red habanero with enough heat to call the firemen! Proceed with caution!



#### Poblano

Classic spicy stuffing pepper. Ripens from green to red but can be eaten at any stage. Only 2,000 Scoville Units.



## Jalapeno

Traditional productive jalapeno. Forms small cracks in skin when fruits mature. (5,000 SHU) Hotter than regular Jalapenos from the grocery store; pick young for more mild peppers.



#### Serrano

Fruity-hot flavor (6,000-17,000 SHU). Extremely productive! Perfect for making sauces and

These 4" long red fruits are super hot and perfect for drying, decoration or adding zing to chilis and stews! 20,000 SHU

The white sister of Ping Tung Long! Perfect for grilling or roasting. Bitter-free.




Caribou Russet

These tiny cukes look like watermelons and taste like pickles! Crunchy, refreshing and unique, the kids will love this one!




Zucchini

These productive and spineless plants make it a joy to harvest! Buttery flavor; excellent grilled.






New York Early

Grows 1-2 feet tall. Buds and roots are medicinal. Attracts bees and beneficial insects.




### Pink Globe Amarath Mix
